

I-94 Road Improvements

**Washtenaw County
July - November 2013**

What Is Being Done?

Starting after the Fourth of July holiday, the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will make improvements to 9 miles of I-94 between M-14 and Carpenter Road, just east of US-23, in Ann Arbor.

Improvements include concrete pavement repairs and resurfacing.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

The project will include off-peak closures at night and on weekends.

As part of the project, motorists can expect directional freeway closures on four specific weekends for pavement patching. Each direction of the freeway, including the connecting ramps, will be closed between M-14 and US-23. The closure will begin Friday night and last through early Monday morning. There will be no more than two weekend closures for each direction (four weekends total), with only one direction of the freeway closed at a time. Dates and more detailed information will be announced in advance.

There will be no lane closures during special events or holiday weekends.

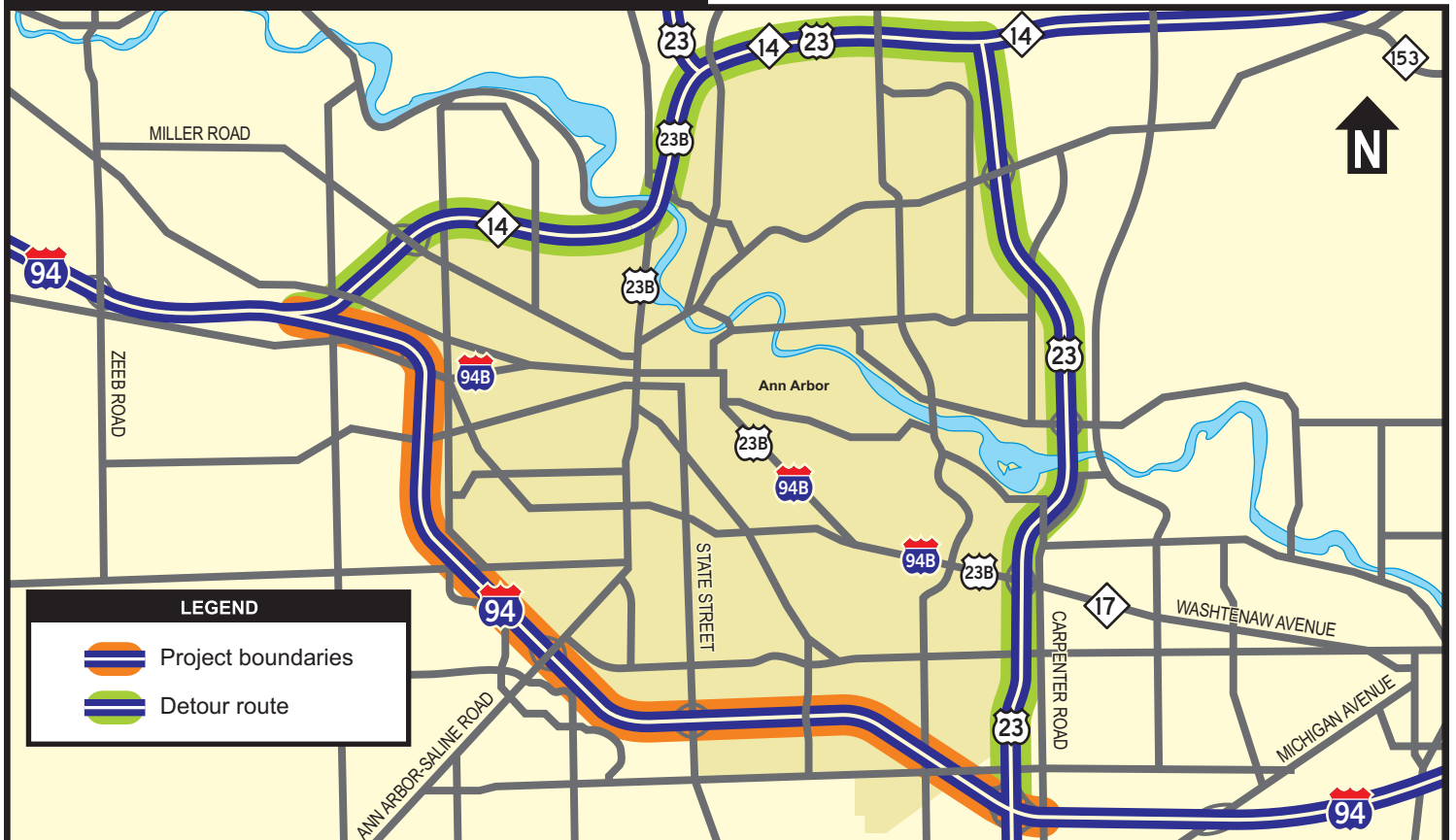
When Will This Be Done?
