Schools of Choice Resolution

In accordance with schools of choice provisions in Section 105 and 105C of the State School Aid Act, I offer the following resolution for first briefing at the March 7^h meeting

RESOLUTION

For Consideration at a Regular Meeting of the Board of Education to be held on March 21, 2012

Whereas, the State School Aid Act has enacted a provision allowing local school districts to enroll nonresident students and count them in membership without having to obtain approval from the district of residence, and

Whereas, Section 105 permits local school districts to enroll students who reside in other local school districts within the same intermediate school district, and

Whereas, each school district can decide whether or not to participate in schools of choice,

Whereas, the Ann Arbor Public Schools wishes to participate in schools of choice on a space-available basis to be determined annually.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Ann Arbor Public Schools will allow limited enrollment as presented, as part of the schools of choice provision – Section 105, for WISD residents (Chelsea, Dexter, Lincoln, Manchester, Milan, Saline, Whitmore Lake, Willow Run and Ypsilanti) not living within the Ann Arbor Public School District, for the 2011-12 school year, and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Ann Arbor Public Schools will comply with the procedures and timelines described in the legislation.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Application Procedure:

- 1. Applications must be completed in their entirety.
- Applications must be submitted during our application period. <u>Applications will not be accepted before April 16 or after May 16.</u> Applications mailed must be postmarked during this period.
- 3. If the number of qualified non-resident applications eligible for acceptance exceeds the number of seats available, students who reside in the same household as students enrolled through Schools of Choice in the current 2011/2012 school year will receive first consideration. A random draw system will be used to determine selection for the remaining spaces (see below).
- 4. A waiting list will be maintained for the remaining applications, the priority order of which will be determined through random draw.
- 5. Applications will be reviewed for accurate information. This may involve contacting the student's current school.
- Student acceptance is conditional until Ann Arbor Public Schools receives and reviews all school discipline records.
- Once enrolled, the student may remain in the Ann Arbor Public Schools through graduation. This does not prohibit the Ann Arbor Public Schools from expelling a student for disciplinary reasons.
- 8. Applicants will be notified of enrollment status by May 31, 2012.

Random Draw and Selection Process:

- 1. Applicants will be asked to identify their 1st through 4th choice. Applications will be grouped by the 1st school choice selected.
- 2. If there are more applications than seats available and after consideration for siblings (refer to #3 above), a random draw will occur for each building separately.
- 3. If there are remaining applications after the random draw, the applications will be grouped by the second choice selected and a similar process will be held.
- 4. This process will continue until all available seats have been filled.
- 5. Any remaining requests will be randomly drawn and placed on a waiting list.
- 6. Names from the waiting listed may be selected through the first week of September 2012.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The Ann Arbor Public Schools Board of Education has approved a non-resident student enrollment policy under Section 105 of the School Aid Act that allows for a limited number of seats in buildings listed below for students not living within the Ann Arbor Public School District. Students living in a school district within Washtenaw Intermediate School District (ISD): Chelsea, Dexter, Lincoln, Manchester, Milan, Saline, Whitmore Lake, Willow Run and Ypsilanti may apply to enroll.

Please note that transportation to and from school is the responsibility of the participating parent/guardian.

Applications are available at the administrative building located at 2555 S. State Street, and on our website www.a2schools.org.

Application Procedure:

- 1. You must complete the application in its entirety.
- Applications must be submitted during our application period. <u>Applications will not be accepted before April 16 or after May 16.</u> Applications mailed must be postmarked during this period.
- 3. If the number of qualified non-resident applications eligible for acceptance exceeds the number of seats available, students who reside in the same household as students enrolled through Schools of Choice in the current 2011/2012 school year will receive first consideration. A random draw system will be used to determine selection for the remaining spaces. A waiting list will be maintained for the remaining applications and prioritized through the random draw.
- 4. Applications will be reviewed for accurate information. This may involve contacting the student's current school.
- 5. Student acceptance is conditional until Ann Arbor Public Schools receives and reviews all school discipline records.
- Once enrolled, the student may remain in the Ann Arbor Public Schools through graduation. This does not prohibit the Ann Arbor Public Schools from expelling a student for disciplinary reasons.
- 7. Applicants will be notified of enrollment status by May 31, 2012.

Enrollment is limited to: 40 seats in Kindergarten; 40 seats in Grade 1; 10 seats each in Grades 2, 3, 4, 5; and 50 seats in Grade 6. The district will determine the number of space at each building and grade after the application window closes.
