Meal Participation

The participation report for September 2012 is attached. Compared to September 2011, average daily breakfasts are up 3.3%, lunches are down 5.9% and A la Carte sales are down 2.6% for September 2012.

School Information

- September was a bit of a challenge this year with the new USDA guidelines, new standard menus, and the reconfiguration of the elementary schools.
- The new guidelines from USDA require all students to take a fruit or vegetable for their meal to be considered complete. Most of our students already chose fruits and vegetables, but we had to teach the others the new guidelines.
- The new standard menus from ARAMARK were a transition for our kitchens because they contained more cooked-from-scratch menu items than in the past. As we progressed through September, the menu items were better received by the students and the kitchen staff members gained better understanding and skills in preparing these new items. A few examples of items that are cooked-from-scratch this year include; pasta dishes, quesadillas, special pizzas at the High School, General Tso's Chicken, Sweet and Sour Chicken, Chicken Salad/Egg Salad/Tuna Salad Sandwiches, and Macaroni and Cheese at the secondary level.
- The reconfiguration of the elementary schools gave us an initial challenge in that we had to estimate how many students would get meals at each building. After just two weeks, we had a better idea of production needs at each building based on the new enrollment figures.

Industry Update

SNA Leaders Meet with USDA Officials on Meal Pattern Challenges

September 26, 2012 – Yesterday, SNA leaders met with representatives from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to discuss the implementation of the new nutrition standards and to share input from SNA members, including successes, suggestions and creative ideas for overcoming challenges of the new meal pattern regulation. Background information was gathered from an SNA news article created to gather more information about the challenges facing SNA members as the implementation phase began this school year.

In just one week, more than 85 comments were received. Highlights of those comments included: Challenges meeting calorie minimums and maximums; grain and protein restrictions and their impact on calorie totals; fruit and vegetable acceptance and plate waste; highly athletic students being hungry; students from food insecure households being hungry; challenges with procurement and existing excess inventory; increased costs; and drastic drops in participation.

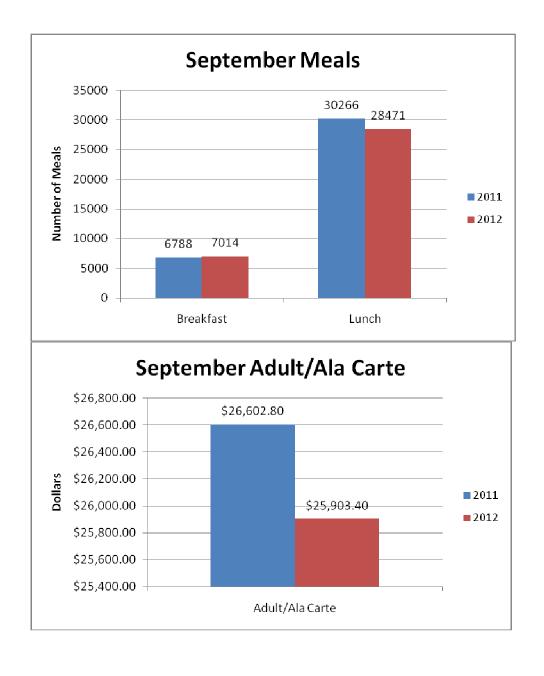

Addendum #1 to the AGREEMENT BETWEEN Lincoln Consolidated Schools and Plante & Moran CRESA, LLC for Owners Representation Services Dated January 1, 2010 ("Original Agreement")

This Addendum made as of the 26th day of October in the year of 2012 between Lincoln Consolidated Schools (LCS) and Plante & Moran CRESA, LLC (PMC). This Addendum provides further clarification as to the services PMC will provide as it relates to Owner's Representation for the LCS Bond Program.

Exhibit A of the Agreement indicates that PMC, in addition to those services set forth in the Original Agreement, provide the following services:

- LCS and PMC hereby agree that the terms and conditions of the Agreement be extended for up to twelve (12) months or up to the completion of the Project to the satisfaction of LCS, whichever is sooner, commencing December 1, 2012.
- LCS and PMC agree to amend the compensation portion of the Agreement to include that LCS shall pay PMC a monthly fee of six thousand and no/100 dollars (\$6,000.00) commencing December 1, 2012 for up to twelve (12) months or to the completion of the Project to the satisfaction of LCS, whichever is sooner.
- Reimbursable expenses: Reimbursable expenses such as mileage, printing, overnight courier services, etc., will be invoiced at actual cost, without mark-up.
- 4 PMC will submit invoices to LCS on a monthly basis, and respectfully request payment terms of net 30 for each invoice.
- 5 Except as modified by this Addendum, all other provisions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
