Community Survey Overview

Despite Michigan's uncertain economy and decreasing property values, support for public transit remains strong. **80 percent of respondents say public transit is important.**

TheRide is well-perceived by the public. Of those who shared an opinion, **91 percent** rated TheRide as favorable.



66 percent – said that they or someone in their family had used public transit within the past year.

72 percent support a new 1-mill property tax for funding a new countywide public transit agency.

At least 80 percent listed the following service improvements as either "very" or "somewhat" important:

- 87 percent Door-to-door service for seniors and the disabled;
- 86 percent Express bus service between park and ride lots and employment centers;
- **84 percent** Existing AATA -- The Ride bus service in Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti would run more frequently, and later in the evening and on weekends;
- **84 percent** An hourly express shuttle bus service would be provided between Detroit Metro Airport and three stops in Ann Arbor including the Blake Transit Center.
- 81 percent A new service using small buses and vans in areas where there are not enough people for regular bus service;
- **81 percent** Information on when the next bus is coming would be provided to cell phones and posted on electronic signs at major bus stops.
