The game got off to a bizarre start as Southwestern fumbled on its first play and Pioneer recovered on the Colt 33. But Hill fumbled on the next play and the Colts recovered.

Four plays later, on a third-and-21 from the 16, Jackson hit end Rick Ampey with a look-in pass over the middle and Ampey outraced the Pioneer secondary for

an 84-yard touchdown.

Southwestern put together a 58-yard drive in nine plays in the second quarter, with Jackson scoring from two yards out.

Ampey caught a pass from Jackson for six yards a TD in the third period and Art Sykes ran over from the two early in the fourth quarter and the Colts were up, 24-0.

Pioneer came back to score its only touchdown on a 65-yard drive in six plays with Hill scoring, but it wasn't long before Southwestern added to its lead.

Bryan Johnson returned the ensuing kickoff 89 yards for six more points. The Colts closed out the scoring late in the game as full-back Bill Luke went off tackle and found daylight for a 59-run for a touchdown.

Pioneer opens South Central Conference play next Friday at Jackson Parkside.
